Weekly News Summary for Sunday, November 24, 2024.

Buxton resident Brian Harris has won write-in election for the open seat for Dare County Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisor. According to the North Carolina Board of Elections, 4,726 write-in votes were tabulated. The votes for Brian Harris were 2,672, for Bryan Harris 17 and for Walter Brian Harris 15. Brian Harris votes were well over 50% of the votes cast.

Soil and Water Conservation Districts are authorized to conduct Community Conservation Assistance Programs, wetlands restoration, erosion and sediment control, stormwater management, stream restoration, clean-up after natural disasters and arranging conservation easements.

Harris currently serves as a board member for the recently-formed Buxton Civic Association.

Weather. A Coastal Flood Advisory was in effect from 4 o'clock on Friday, November 22, unit 4 o'clock Saturday afternoon. The advisory was issued by the National Weather Service, which also posted a Gale Warning and Small Craft Advisory.

The advisory, which called for a possible one to two feet inundation, was called due to predicted westerly winds. The wind did blow consistently from the west. In Frisco, the high wind gust was 36 miles per hour around midnight. In Rodanthe, the highest gust was 40 miles per hour around 2:30 early Saturday morning.

Late afternoon Friday, soundside water encroached on NC 12's southbound lane at Brick Creek in Salvo. Ditches were full at the north end of Avon and into the Cape Hatteras National Seashore.

At 4 o'clock Saturday morning, Brian Van Druten posted an NC 12 report on Facebook:

From Buxton north, ditches are full on the north end of Avon and north to Little Kinnakeeet. Some places (water is) slightly over the white line. "I took Colony (in Salvo) to avoid the Wind over Waves areas. Last thing to avoid is tide has spilled out of the ditch just south of REAL into the northbound lane."

As a result of Tropical Storm Helene, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has opened a grant opportunity for Dare County homeowners to elevate homes above base flood elevation through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. Eligible properties include houses below base flood elevation, and located in Special Flood Hazard Areas or on a repetitive loss list. The agency considers a property to be a repetitive loss if it has had two or more flood insurance claims of over \$1,000 paid by the National Flood Insurance Program in any 10-year period since 1978. All property owners in Dare County that meet these criteria are eligible; however, due to the limited funding available, Dare County will prioritize primary residence homeowner applications.

The Hazard Mitigation Grant Program covers 100 percent of elevation costs. Applicants should be aware that the typical timeline from submitting an application to receiving the award is three to five years.

Property revaluation set. The countywide Dare County property revaluation will become effective Jan 1, 2025. Dare County is currently on a five-year revaluation schedule, with the last revaluation implemented in Jan 2020. Revaluation is the process of updating property values for all real estate in Dare County—including residential and commercial improved properties, as well as vacant land—to reflect current market value, which is the most probable price a particular property would bring at sale in an open and competitive market.

Over time, property values can change due to market conditions, development or other economic factors. Revaluation ensures that assessments reflect these changes so that taxes are based on the current market value of properties. In an effort to provide Dare County's property owners with more detailed information about the revaluation Dare County has launched an informational webpage that can be accessed at Dare NC dot gov slash Revaluation. The webpage has a comprehensive overview of the process, a timeline for its completion, a comparable sales search tool and the answers to an assortment of frequently asked questions

All other Dare County offices and facilities will reopen with normal operating hours on Monday, December 2, 2024.

The revised trash collection schedule for Hatteras Island is as follows:

There will be one residential pickup per area during the week of Thanksgiving:

Mond, Nov 25, 2024: Buxton, Frisco and Hatteras. Regular trash collection will resume on Mon, December 2, 2024.

Tues, Nov 26, 2024: Rodanthe, Waves, Salvo and Avon. Regular trash collection will resume on Tues, December 3.

On Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, no residential trash collection is scheduled.

Commercial dumpster collection will take place on Monday, November 25, 2024 and Wednesday, November 27, 2024. Regular commercial trash collection will resume on Monday, December 2, 2024.
