Weekly News Summary for Sunday, November 10, 2024.

Dare's commissioners agree to submit grant for Frisco pathway. At the request of the Outer Banks National Scenic Byway committee and Frisco-Buxton Pathway committee, the Dare County Board of Commissioners agreed to submit a National Scenic Byway Grant Application. The grant application proposes to build 1/2mi on the Oceanside of NC12 from Sno-Balls&Ice Cream to the Billy Mitchell Rd that leads to the Frisco Airport, the Frisco Nat'l Park Service Campground and Beach Access Ramp49. Frisco & Buxton are the only villages without completed paved multi-use pathways. The 5ft wide concrete pathways provide safe space for walkers, runners and biking. The pathway will be installed in the NC12 right-of-way and separate from traffic lanes. The 1/2mi pathway is estimated to cost half-a-million dollars with the Dare County Tourism Board contributing \$100K for the required matching funds.

Cape Hatteras Electric continues replacing poles. Next week, Cape Hatteras Electric Cooperative will be continuing its work to replace transmission poles in Frisco. This will require temporary lane closures on NC12 between the hours of 6-7:30 at night, Monday through Thursday, November 11-14. The cooperative is replacing about 60 transmission poles. The project's contractor River City Construction is contracted to replace 34 wooden transmission poles on the Avon South circuit with concrete poles. The contractor is also replacing 25 wooden poles in Frisco and Hatteras with concrete poles. The traffic closures could last up to 20 minutes as each new pole is delivered to the work sites. These large concrete poles require a crane to offload, stated the cooperative in an update.

General Election results. As a result of the Nov 5 election, Republicans now control all seats on the Dare County Board of Commissioners and Dare County Board of Education. Almost 74% of eligible voters cast ballots in this election. Dare County voters also supported Republican candidates on all state and federal races. Commissioners live in specific districts but are elected countywide.

Commissioners-elect will be sworn in December 2, 2024, and they are:

District 1: Carson Creef; District 1 for the unexpired term: Mike Burrus; District 2: Robert L. "Bob" Woodard Sr., the incumbent; District 3: Steve House, the incumbent; District 4: Mary Ellon Ballance from Hatteras village. Remaining as commissioners are Rob Ross and Ervin Bateman

Elected to the Dare County Board of Education are: David Twiddy at large; Justin Bateman from District 1; Lisa Lloyd from District 2; Kenny Brite from District 4, which is Hatteras Island. Brite lives in Avon. Remaining on the Board of Education are Ron Payne, Matt Brauer and Barry Wickre. Board members will be sworn in Dec 9, 2024.

Fessenden Center Gym named for Danny Couch. At the Nov 4 Dare County Board of Commissioners meeting, Chairman Bob Woodard announced that the gymnasium located within the Fessenden Center in Buxton has been named the Daniel C. "Danny" Couch Gymnasium in the longtime Commissioner's honor. A lifelong Hatteras Island resident, Danny has been involved in the public service arena for roughly 30yrs, and has spent the past 8yrs as Hatteras Island's representative on the seven-member Dare County Board of Commissioners.

Chairman Woodard presented Certificates of Appreciations to the three outgoing commissioners whose terms will expire in December 2024. Vice Chairman Wally Overman, Commissioner Danny Couch and Commissioner Bea Basnight were each recognized for their dedication and service to the Dare County community during the current board's final November meeting before these three commissioners' respective terms conclude next month.

The conference room located within the Dare County Department of Health & Human Services Building in Manteo has been named the Walter L. "Wally" Overman Conference Room in honor of Vice Chairman Overman.

The schedule changes at nighttime.
