National Seashore reopens a portion of Buxton Beach

The Cape Hatteras National Seashore has reopened about two-tenths-of-a-mile section of beach starting at the southernmost jetty in Buxton and continuing to the south, also known as Old Lighthouse Beach.

Varying sections of the Buxton Beach have been closed to the public since September 2023 after two offshore hurricanes revealed petroleum smells and abandoned infrastructure from former 1956-2010 military bases. This recently-reopened section of the Buxton shoreline was closed September 5, 2024, after heightened erosion resulted in the further degradation of the Buxton Formerly Used Defense Site.

The National Park Service says visitors to Old Lighthouse Beach should use the parking lot near the lifeguarded beach until the Corps' contractor completes the removal of its equipment from near the northern parking lot adjacent to the Old Lighthouse Beach Access.

The decision to essentially revert to the original three-tenths-of-a-mile closure area adjacent to the Buxton Beach Access was made after factoring in the amount of contaminated soil and water removed by the Corps and the prolonged period of time between the last report of apparent petroleum sheens or odors in the area.

Contaminated soil and water are likely still present in the beach adjacent to the Buxton site, so the seashore personnel will continue to monitor, and keep this three-tenths-of-mile section of beach closed to the public.

An amended precautionary public health advisory by the Dare County Department of Health and Human Services is forthcoming.

In the coming months, the Corps is expected to comprehensively sample soil and groundwater within the Buxton site with the intent to delineate the nature and extent of any petroleum contamination remaining at the site.

Dare County receives upgraded ratings

On Nov. 14, 2024, Fitch Ratings upgraded two of Dare County's credit ratings.

The Issurer Default Rating was moved to AA+ from AA and the county's credit rating on Limited Obligation Bonds moved to AA from AA-.

According to the announcement, "the rating reflects an 'ample' level of budgetary flexibility and assumes maintenance of unrestricted general funds reserves at least equal to 7.5% of spending.

The county has historically maintained reserves above the 25% fund balance policy." In Fiscal Year 2024, ending June 30, 2024, the fund balance was 35.74%, an increase from 33.89% from the prior year, according to the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2024, which is now posted on DareNC.gov.

The upgraded ratings will influence the interest rate offered on limited obligation bonds which the county issues for its ongoing construction projects.

The AA+ for the Issuer Default Rating is "one of the highest credit ratings that can be assigned by Fitch Ratings, placing Dare County among a select group of local governments nationwide," states a media release from Dare County.

The upgrade is based on financial performance, economic stability, balanced economic and demographic factors and high revenue-raising capacity, states the media release.

Manteo license plate office to close December 31

On Friday, December 20, Dare County Board of Commissioners Chairman Bob Woodard issued a statement regarding the upcoming closure of the license plate agency in Manteo on December 31, and the steps that are currently being taken by the county to open a new agency.

Chairman Woodard said:

The closure of the Manteo license plate agency on December 31, 2024, is a serious concern, and we understand the inconvenience this poses for our residents.

While the operation and oversight of license plate agencies fall under the jurisdiction of the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles (NCDMV), we want to assure you that we are fully committed to advocating for a resolution on behalf of Dare County.

The current contractor's retirement and the NCDMV's facility requirements have created challenges. However, there are discussions with a potential new contractor who is interested in operating in Dare County.

We are working diligently to expedite this process and minimize disruption in service for our community. Although Dare County does not have direct control over this situation, please know that I remain steadfast in my commitment to ensuring our residents' needs are addressed as effectively and efficiently as possible.
